Cox's Market

This Neo Classical building was built in the 1920's, yet still maintains its original character. It has served as a market center for Tustin families for many years and has been in Phil and Linda Cox's family since the 1940's.

## **Neighborhood Beautification Award The Vanderlip House**

665 West Main Street

This Italianate Victorian house was moved from its original location on the other side of Main Street. New paint colors and elegant new landscaping charmed our judges who chose it for the award.



## **Special Presentation Award The Stanton House**

515 West 3rd Street

Formerly a beauty shop with a glassed-in front porch, this home has been returned by its owners to its original California Bungalow style. The warm green house color with contrasting dark green and deep red trim, along with the appropriate plantings earned the judges admiration and this award.
